Health Connection brings together medical and non-medical volunteers to serve as health advocates and to alleviate suffering by providing basic health services, follow-up care and health education to those in need.

Whether you are a health professional or a loving person with a car—often just driving someone to a medical appointment and/or visiting them is a huge encouragement.

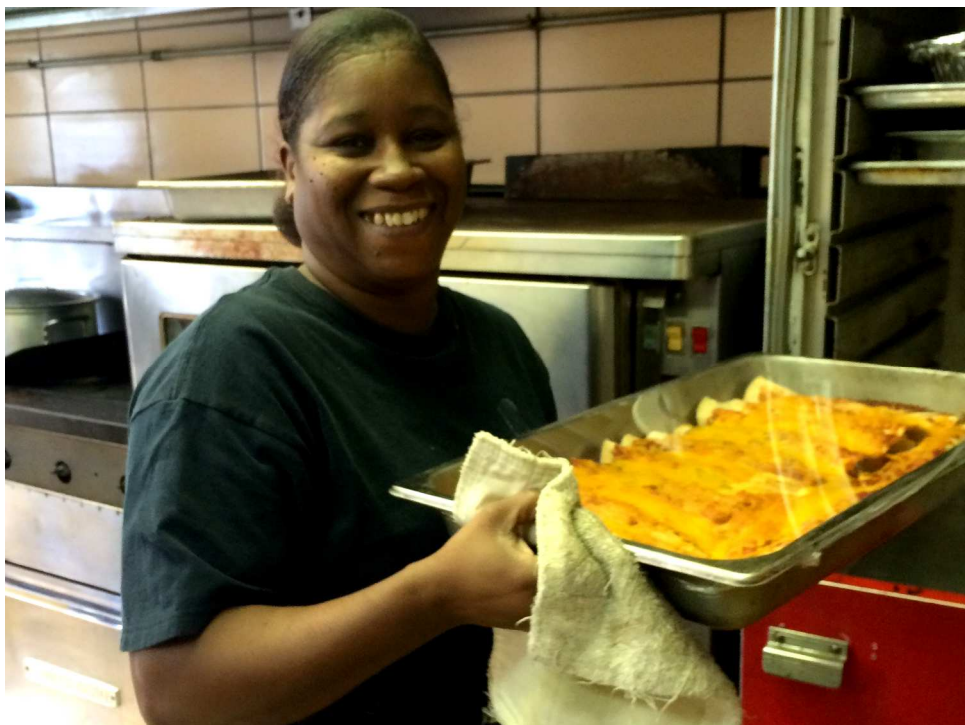

Inside Out Prison Ministry and its church partners engage in the discipleship of offenders and ex-offenders by calling them to surrender their lives to the love and provision of Jesus Christ for them, their families, and their futures through in-prison Bible Studies, one-on-one correspondence, GED/HSE training, and post-prison support groups, and to share that same love and provision with their fellow inmates, their prison staff, their families and their communities.

How can you get involved?

Become a mentor on the Outside, pairing up with an incarcerated offender through writing letters. Become a mentor on the Inside, visiting, participating in / leading life classes. Build relationships with organizations for job and housing connections. Volunteer to offer one-on-one counseling and mentoring. Assist in leading support groups. DONATE.
