Restore St. Louis is a group of seven ministries birthed and under the oversight of New City Fellowship Church. Each of the seven ministries are led by their own boards.

Vision

The vision of Restore St. Louis is to see the Church of St. Louis express the love of Christ by meeting needs of the community, especially the poor, the widow, the fatherless, the imprisoned, the immigrant and the refugee.

Mission

The mission of Restore St. Louis is to disciple and equip the Church to do Spirit-led deeds of justice and mercy in St. Louis because we believe that Jesus has called the Church to display His glory by doing justice, loving mercy, and walking humbly with our God. By God's grace, we will accomplish this mission by recruiting, training, coaching, and unleashing disciples of Jesus to lead the Church in completing this work.

Firm Foundation serves 120 children from 53 families. Those children come from a dozen nations and speak 15 languages. During the school year, 160 volunteers provide 12,480 hours of tutoring. During the summer, Firm Foundation hosts an intensive six-week Summer Enrichment Program that provides an all-day educational camp.

Firm Foundation envisions academically at-risk children and youth from our community serving more productively in our culture in part, because they have received academic assistance and have come to know the love of God through caring, mutually beneficial relationships facilitated by the Firm Foundation Tutoring Program.

Firm Foundation Tutoring, a Christ-centered academic assistance program, teams a diverse group of volunteer tutors with at-risk children and youth in after-school tutoring and summer enrichment programs.


The Lord watches over the foreigner and sustains the fatherless and the widow, but he frustrates the ways of the wicked.



Through Harambee Youth Training Corporation, 88 youth provided \$216,000 worth of free tuckpointing to low-income homeowners in the City of St. Louis in the last year. While working, the youth hear the Good News of the Gospel and see its' practical implications as they serve widow, seniors and disabled individuals in the City.

All of this is to be done in the context of serving the elderly, widows, immigrants, singleparent households and the poor.


Health Connection serves 33 families speaking seven languages coming from 10 countries. Volunteers include doctors, nurses, medical and nursing students and other individuals. A primary goal is to get those with no health care connected to a primary care physician who can provide consistent, on-going healthcare.






Umetulisha serves 12 St. Louis ministries by providing 250,000 meals and snacks for their participants. About 5,000 individuals are served annually.






